Dear Custodians,

Re: Timbavati Private Nature Reserve sustainable utilization offtakes – 2020/2021

As per our telephonic conversation on 28 February 2019, the Timbavati Private Nature Reserve (TPNR) intends to make 50% of the 2020/2021 sustainable utilization off-takes available for members of the Custodians of Professional Hunting & Conservation – South Africa. The 2020/2021 sustainable utilizations off-takes are however not guaranteed and can only be determined once all the required ecological studies have been undertaken and the essential endorsements and approvals granted. These endorsements and approvals involve our Associated Private Nature Reserve (APNR) neighbours, the Kruger National Park (KNP), the Mpumalanga Tourism and Parks Agency (MTPA) and the Limpopo Department of Economic Development, Environment and Tourism (LEDET).

In 2018, the “Greater Kruger Hunting Protocol” was revised and standardised and the TPNR participates in this ongoing process, together with the KNP, MTPA and LEDET. The TPNR is proud to implement ethical hunting practices, maintain the ecological integrity of our reserve, be compliant with legal requirements and ensure the equitable distribution of benefits from the use of our natural resources.

The TPNR remains sensitive to local conservation challenges and global trends and will continue to look at ways to improve and diversify our revenue model. As a citizen of the Greater Limpopo Transfrontier Conservation Area (GLTFCA), the TPNR is committed to the “big picture” where multiple land-uses co-exist and common ethical norms regulate how we protect, utilise and benefit from nature.
